Burn Camp is a continuation of care program for children with life-altering burn injuries. Children who attend camp have the chance to share their emotions and stories in a safe, nurturing and fun environment. Activities and events also help campers gain social confidence, face challenges and navigate life beyond their injuries. We support burn survivors of all ages in all stages of recovery.

Our Burn Camp Staff is 100% volunteer and comprised of firefighters, teachers, medical professionals, burn survivors, and many others who help make a difference in the lives of these young survivors.



Burn Camp takes place at Camp Timber-lee in East Troy, WI. With over 600 acres, a private lake, and countless activities, Timber-lee's vast campus provides one of the best summer camp experiences Wisconsin has to offer.



Overnight Camp serves kids ages 7 to 17 and is a week long program.

Explorers Camp is a one day program for kids under the age of 7 or any child not ready for overnight camp.

The Young Adult Leadership Program (YALP) is for survivors ages 18–21 and focuses on building leadership skills. Many YALP graduates transition into camp staff roles at age 21.
